JFK/LBJ Secret Service Agents list

I. Presidential and Vice Presidential White House Detail (WHD) and Protective Research Section (PRS) Agents

(In alphabetical order; WHD and PRS unless otherwise indicated.)¹

Anderson, Howard S. SAIC of Personnel; became the director of training at the Training Division in the summer of 1967; took part in first formal Secret Service agent training held in Washington D.C. October 19 – November 6, 1953 as an instructor; instructor at Secret Service School number 4, January 10 – February 4, 1955; WHD: FDR era; had been an assistant supervising agent during the Truman years; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; a charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969; attended third annual AFAUSS conference in Alexandria, Virginia, September 27–28, 1974; pictured on pp. 36 and 57 of the AFAUSSS book (1991). Deceased.

Bacherman, William J. “Bill”. WHD: November 10, 1963 to at least November 23, 1963 (shift reports; also listed as “Backerman” several times); sent letter to HSCA’s Blakey (April 11, 1978). Deceased.

Baughman, Urbanus “U. E.”. Chief, 1948 – September 1961; began his Service career December 27, 1927 as a stenographer in the Philadelphia office, during FDR era; was commissioned as an agent in 1934; in May of 1941 became ASAIC of New York District followed by SAIC of Newark District; in 1945 became SAIC of Washington, D.C. field office; was on Margaret Truman’s White House detail when she was in New York; in 1947 or 1948 was SAIC of the New York District before being made Chief on November 29, 1948, and remained Chief until JFK era, when he retired in September 1961; took part in Secret Service School number 4, January 10 – February 4, 1955; wrote his book *Secret Service Chief* (1962/1963); wrote the foreword to Bowen and Neal’s 1960 book *The United States Secret Service*; credited in Robert Donovan’s *The Assassins*; appears in the film *The Making of the President 1960*; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961 (lead car); a charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969; attended AFAUSS conference in 1973. Walter Pine: brother-in-law. Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 28, 2004: “Baughman was OK ... from the old school, of course. He always wanted us to wear hats. Can you imagine wearing a hat and arresting a counterfeiter or wearing one when you worked the follow-up?” Deceased November 1978.

Bechtle, Gerald W. V.P. LBJ Detail; after assassination, assigned to guarding Lady Bird with Kivett and Woody Taylor; Reagan era: Assistant Director of Protective Operations (see also 16 H 950-1); now head of security for the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System; married with 3 sons.

Behn, SAIC Gerald A. In Secret Service September 1939 – January 1967; attended MSU; assigned to Detroit, Michigan office, then WFO; attended Treasury School in New York City; assigned to WHD in 1941; took part in third Secret Service school held in November–December 1954 as an instructor; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; became SAIC in September 1961; January 1965: became SAIC of Special Investigations; worked for the Post Office for four years after retiring from Secret Service (boss: JFK aide Bill Hartigan); a charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969; attended third annual AFAUSS conference in Alexandria, Virginia, September 27–28, 1974; interviewed by the FBI (November 27, 1963), the JFK Library (February 24, 1976), and the HSCA (January 30, 1978, and in Executive Session March 15, 1978); interviewed for Manchester, *The Death of a President* (December 18, 1964); Jim Bishop, *Mortal Error* (1992), short comment; interviewed for Anthony Summers, *The Arrogance of Power: The Secret World of Richard Nixon*; pictured in AFAUSSS book (1991); pictured in Darwin Horn's book. Wife: Jean Brownell Behn; two daughters: Sandra Lee Kane of Springfield, and Barbara Jean Shipley of Vienna; four grandchildren. Deceased April 21, 1993.

Bendickson, Donald. V.P. LBJ Detail (see also 16 H 950-1); interviewed for Venker's 1988 book (p. 144).

Bennett, Glen A. Born July 12, 1928; joined the Secret Service on October 5, 1959; started in Cleveland, Ohio office; then went to PRS; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; interviewed by HSCA (January 30, 1978; also December 29, 1976 letter from Glenn Bennett to HSCA's Robert Blakey regarding the agent's whereabouts and address: November 16, 1977: outside contact report); 1978: Intelligence Division; pictured in AFAUSSS book (1991). Deceased April 4, 1994.

Berger, Andrew E. 1978: SAIC Baltimore, Maryland; interviewed by HSCA (May 22, 1978). Wife: Catherine Frances "Dolly" Ferguson Berger.

Blaine, Gerald S. Started in the Denver office; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; WHD: Eisenhower to LBJ 1964; left to work for IBM: became director of security; interviewed for Manchester, *The Death of a President* (May 12, 1965); a charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969; pictured on p. 79 of AFAUSSS book (1991); now the Director of International Security Company for ARCO International Oil & Gas (like Burke, Blaine is part of The Overseas Security Advisory Council and the U.S. Department of State).

Blaschak, Walter. WHD Clerk, at least Eisenhower to early JFK eras; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; pictured on p. 67 of the AFAUSSS book from 1991. Darwin Horn wrote the author on March 2,

2004: "He was very good. He and Rowley were good friends. He was from the PA area." Deceased.

Bolden, Abraham Wendell, Sr. Temporary assignment in June 1961: first African-American on WHD (also first African-American agent of Pinkerton Detective Agency); entered the Service in October 1960 (1959?); separated in May 1964; *Washington News* and *San Francisco Chronicle* (May 21, 1964); *New York Times* (December 6, 1967); *Ramparts* magazine (January 1968), pp. 67–68; *National Tattler* (July 5, 1970); a source for the 1975 *Chicago Independent* article; interviewed by Mark Lane (*Rush to Judgment*, p. 275; *A Citizen's Dissent*, p. 193), as well as Bud Fensterwald (AARC file) and Ian Calder (*Nashville Enquirer* [May 25, 1968]); interviewed by the HSCA (January 19, 1978); forthcoming book due out in 2007; featured in *Ultimate Sacrifice* (2005); brief TV appearance: Discovery Channel, May 11, 2006.

Boring, ASAIC Floyd M. Spent approximately five years in the Pennsylvania State Police; joined the Secret Service November 9, 1943; first assignment was New York with FDR Jr. and the kids; moved on to PRS; joined the WHD March 1, 1944; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961 (follow-up car); retired in March 1967; worked security for the United Nations for a while, then went to work for Milton Kayle; worked for G. Ross Perot for a time; went to work security for Motown Records; retired from that position around 1987; founded the Association of Former Agents of the Secret Service in 1969; attended AFAUSS conference in 1973; received plaque; attended third annual AFAUSS conference in Alexandria, Virginia, September 27–28, 1974; interviewed for Baughman, *Secret Service Chief*, pp. 68–69; interviewed by the JFK Library (February 25, 1976; not released until January 1998), the Truman Library (September 21, 1988), and the ARRB (September 18, 1996); see also 2 H 90, 105, 107, 111, 136–7; 4 H 342; 5 H 67; 25 H 774–7; *Truman* (1992); short comment in *Mortal Error* (1992); *Inside the Secret Service* video (1995); *Truman*, PBS (1997) with Rex Scouten; *Inside the U.S. Secret Service* documentary (2004); pictured in AFAUSSS book from 1991; pictured on the cover of Darwin Horn's book. Wife: Ruth.

Bouck, Robert Inman. SAIC of PRS until 1967; retired in 1968; joined Service in 1939; WFO personnel officer; 1952–7: in charge of all Treasury law enforcement training (examples: took part in first formal Secret Service agent training held in Washington, D.C., October 19 – November 6, 1953 as an instructor; Director of Secret Service School number 4, January 10 – February 4, 1955; the SAIC Administration School in 1955; the SAIC Administration School in April 1956); June 1957: became head of PRS; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961, as head of PRS; a charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969; attended third annual AFAUSS conference in Alexandria, Virginia, September 27–28, 1974; interviewed by the Warren Commission (April 23, 1964), the JFK Library (June 25, 1976), the HSCA (August 30, 1977; November 4, 1977: outside contact report; November 10, 1977; November 11, 1977: outside contact report; November 16, 1977: executive session; April 18, 1978: outside contact report; May 2, 1978: outside contact report; August 18, 1978: outside contact report), for *High Treason 2* (November 16, 1991), by Seymour Hersh (December 1995), and the ARRB

(May 2, 1996); pictured on pp. 57, 62, 63 of AFAUSSS book from 1991; *The Secret White House Tapes*, A&E (March 1997). Wife: Marjorie. Deceased.

Brown, Percy Hamilton "Ham". Assigned to Hyannis Port: Joseph P. Kennedy's detail; member of Transportation Section, LBJ era; in Service up to Reagan era; former Executive Secretary of the AFAUSSS. Don Stebbins, the current Executive Secretary of the AFAUSSS, wrote the author on February 27, 2004: "Mr. Brown was with the Secret Service for 26 years and served in several field offices and on several Presidential Protection Details." Pictured on pp. 85, 95 of AFAUSSS book (1991); short comment in *Mortal Error* (1992); *Case Closed* (1993), p. 503; *Star* (June 28, 1994) regarding Jack Walsh; ABC (January 28, 1998); *Dateline* (March 1998); interviewed for Edward Klein, *Just Jackie: Her Private Years* (Ballantine Books, 1999).

Burke, Robert R. On V.P. Humphreys' detail 1967; Carter era: Assistant Director for Training, then Assistant Director for Protective Intelligence; Reagan era: Acting Assistant Director of Investigations, and Assistant Director of PRS in 1981; now head of security for OSAC and the Director of Corporate Service and Security for the Monsanto Company (testified on C-Span September 3, 1997); also mentioned on Air Force One tapes November 22, 1963 with Payne; mentioned in Youngblood's book; pictured on p. 84 of AFAUSSS book (1991); see also 3 HSCA 400; outside contact report with HSCA (September 22, 1978).

Burns, Paul A. Became SAIC of former President Truman's Detail in 1965; pictured on p. 79 of AFAUSSS book (1991).

Campion, John E. ASAIC (see 3 HSCA 400), then Aide to the Assistant Chief for Security (report on bubbletop: CD 3 Exhibits); around since the FDR days; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; worked on advance preparations during the early part of the JFK administration; mentioned on p. 19 of Youngblood's book, and in Boring's JFK Library Oral History, as well as p. 171 of Baughman's book; pictured in Gallagher's book; pictured on p. 70 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 27, 2004: "I had wanted to be on his shift in August 1954 when I was assigned to the WHD but they put me on Gerry McCann's shift instead. John was a very straight line arrow and easy to work with. His reputation was extremely good. You work well and you would have no problem with John." Deceased.

Chandler, Toby J. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; Secret Service school in Washington, D.C., (since at least) November 1, 1963; November 4–8, 1963; November 12–15, 1963; November 18–22, 1963; November 2, 1963; November 3, 1963; November 9, 1963; November 16, 1963; November 17, 1963: "DO"; November 23, 1963: on duty, LBJ's home (Secret Service shift reports).

Chaney, George. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961 (3 HSCA 400).

Coughlin, J. Walter. Coughlin wrote to the author on February 29, 2004, detailing his entire Secret Service career: "February 1961 through March 1977: Charleston, West Virginia—Counterfeit Detail N[ew] Y[ork] C[ity]—White House: June 1962 – December 1964—VP Detail December 1964 to January 1969—ASAIC Louisville, K[entuck]y—SAIC Omaha, Neb[raska]—SAIC Dallas—transferred to Foreign Dignitary Division, D.C., to process out of S[ecret] S[ervice] for medical retirement ([due to] ulcers)." Coughlin added on April 28, 2005: "I went to the WH in June of '62 and lived in various apts. More concerned about social activities than nearness to WH. Married in '65 and bought a house in Rockville, Md. 2 children Brendan 38 w[ith] 3 small boys—successful businessman in Dallas—Kelly 36 (Bennett) mother of boy and girl—stay at home mom in Dallas. Wife Ann born and raised in NW D.C. (Georgetown), 40th anniversary this June 26 [2005]." Oral History, Texas A&M University Library, April 19, 1986; now president of J. Walter Coughlin & Associates, an international security consulting firm, headquartered in Dallas, Texas; pictured on pp. 88, 91, 92 of the AFAUSSS book (1991).

Daniels, Russell "Buck". Joined the Service in 1929 as stenographer in the Kansas City office; Inspector (1954); Deputy Chief (1957): discharged January 31, 1961, replaced by Paterni; took part in the SAIC Administration School in April 1956; a charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969. Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 28, 2004: "Daniels was a real gentleman ... a fine person. I didn't interact with him very often." Pictured on pp. 63, 69 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Deceased.

Davis, William C. Garage; Special Officer designation. Former agent Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 25, 2004: "Davis was from the Carolinas and worked the WHD for a while. He never brought much attention to himself. I believe that he worked in the Charlotte Office."

DeFreese, Lubert F. "Bert". Born October 25, 1925; married with one daughter; 1978: ATSAIC, WFO; started in agency in Chicago office on October 8, 1956, remaining until 1958 when he was transferred to the WFO; member of the WHD; had been on Eisenhower's "grandkiddie" detail along with Max Phillips (*Secret Service Chief*, p. 140); Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; interviewed by HSCA (February 2, 1978). Walt Coughlin wrote the author on May 6, 2005: "Bert was very quiet and reserve[d]. Very professional. Hard to get close to." Deceased.

Dempsher, Eve B. Secretary; attended third annual AFAUSSS conference in Alexandria, Virginia, September 27–28, 1974.

Dolan, Jerry. In Secret Service 1961–4; guarded Jackie and the kids up to April 1964; joined the St. Paul, Minnesota police afterwards; *St. Paul Pioneer Press Dispatch* (November 20, 1988; August 13, 1993). Wife: Josephine. Deceased August 9, 1993.

Doster, Paul B. WHD: Truman to early JFK; took part in Secret Service School number 4, January 10 – February 4, 1955; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; SAIC of Nashville office early in JFK's term;

Nashville Banner (May 18, 1963) regarding JFK's trip (including captioned photo); Paul's widow interviewed for same paper (January 23, 1992). Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 28, 2004: "I took Doster's place on the WHD in August 1954. He was always delighted to tell me how he appreciated that. He died young." Deceased 1987.

Duncan, Edith E. PRS: Bouck's secretary; had been former Chief U. E. Baughman's secretary (*Secret Service Chief*, p. 37); interviewed by the HSCA May 3, 1978: outside contact report; May 13, 1978: outside contact report; May 15, 1978. Deceased.

Duncan, William L. "Bill". Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; became Assistant Director of protective forces training at the Training Division in the summer of 1967; Nixon: ASAIC (in charge of First Family) until let go by Haldeman in 1972; picture with caption in *Fort Worth Press* (November 22, 1963); McCarthy, pp. 217–8; Venker, p. 58; Melanson, p. 157; now part of an acclaimed security firm with Wunderlich.

Faison, Robert R. "Bob". African-American; 1962: WFO (3 HSCA 401); pictured on p. 85 of AFAUSSS book (1991).

Flohr, Deeter B. "Dick". Eisenhower's driver, garage detail; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; PRS; began White House duty in approximately 1937; mentioned in *Secret Service Chief*, p. 174, and Youngblood, p. 47; pictured on pp. 66, 70, 71 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Deceased February 24, 1996.

Foster, Robert W. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961 (follow-up car); SAIC of "Kiddie Detail"; in Secret Service for 22 years before retiring in 1978; 1988: U.S. Marshal for the Southern District of Ohio; interviewed for Manchester, *The Death of a President* (November 18, 1964); picture in Stoughton, p. 148, and *John F. Kennedy: A Life in Pictures*, p. 198; *Columbus Dispatch* (November 20, 1988); NBC, etc. (July 1999) regarding the death of JFK Jr.

Fox, James K. "Jack". PRS photographer; served in the agency during Truman era; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961, as a clerk in PRS; interviewed by HSCA (August 7, 1978: outside contact report) and Mark Crouch. Deceased 1987.

Galup, Stanley B. Joined the Secret Service in 1962 at the age of 46; the former Detroit police officer and monk was immediately posted to Hyannis Port, Massachusetts, to guard the Kennedys' summer home; 23 years as a special officer with the U.S. Secret Service: he was assigned to guard facilities in which presidents and vice presidents stay or visit; 1975: received a transfer to the Detroit office of the Secret Service and worked there until he retired in 1985; *Detroit Free Press* (July 23, 1999).

Giannoules, Kenneth S. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; Nixon era: Interpol National Central Bureau Chief, Department of the Treasury.

Gies, Morgan L. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; SAIC of Garage Detail; had been Truman's driver in Washington, D.C.; took part in Secret Service school number 8 in January 1956; attended third annual AFAUSS conference in Alexandria, Virginia, September 27–28, 1974; pictured on p. 62 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Deceased.

Giuffre, John J. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; "Kiddie Detail": from Indianapolis (and Dallas) Office(s); Ford era: SAIC of an office.

Godfrey, Arthur Lincoln. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; ATSAIC; served in the Army in Europe during World War II, decorations included a Silver Star, a Bronze Star, and a Purple Heart; received the Silver Star for rescuing a soldier and carrying him back to friendly lines in Italy while under enemy fire; MSU graduate; member of WHD Truman to Nixon; a recipient of the Treasury Department's Albert Gallatin Award; took part in Secret Service school number 8 in January 1956; retired July 1974; mentioned in McNally's book, p. 120; pictured on pp. 62, 66, 67, 102 of AFAUSSS book (1991); p. 176 of Darwin Horn's book; interviewed for Anthony Summers, *The Arrogance of Power: The Secret World of Richard Nixon* (Penguin USA, 2001), including picture; the official photographer for the AFAUSSS. Deceased May 12, 2002.

Goodenough, James R. "Jim". V.P. LBJ Detail (see also 16 H 950–1; p. 93 of Youngblood's book); LBJ era: assigned to Luci Johnson's detail; in Secret Service from August 1959 until April 1985.

Grant, David B. 1978: V.P. Protective Detail; p. 233 of Youngblood's book regarding advance for Nixon's first inaugural with Livingood; interviewed by HSCA (February 3, 1978; March 15, 1978: executive session); short comment in *Mortal Error* (1992); pictured on p. 95 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Brother-in-law: fellow former agent Clinton J. Hill!

Greer, William R. Garage; served in the Navy during World War II: in 1944 assigned to FDR's yacht, the *Potomac*; transferred to the Secret Service in 1946; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; retired in 1966; attended third annual AFAUSS conference in Alexandria, Virginia, September 27–28, 1974; interviewed by FBI (November 22, 1963; November 27, 1963), Warren Commission (March 9, 1964), William Manchester (November 19, 1964), Jim Bishop, David Lifton (November 20, 1967; January 18, 1971), Walt Brown (1970), researchers for Newcomb and Adams (December 6, 1970; June 26, 1971), HSCA (January 4, 1978: outside contact report; February 28, 1978; September 6, 1978: outside contact report; December 4, 1978: outside contact report), Robert Milner (1978–85), and *Asheville Citizen-Times* (November 6, 1983). First wife: Ethel, passed away 1969; son: Richard; second wife: Mary Finger. Deceased February 23, 1985.

Griffith, James H. "Jim". WFO: 1950s; took part in the SAIC Administration School in 1955; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961, as an ASAIC of the WFO; 1961 (3 HSCA 400); later became SAIC of Cincinnati office; pictured on pp. 63, 64 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Deceased.

Halterman, Dennis R. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961. Walt Coughlin wrote the author on April 27, 2005: "Dennis died a terrible death w[ith] brain cancer." Deceased 1988.

Hall, Ned II. 1962: WFO (3 HSCA 401, 420); assisted Bill Duncan in protective forces training at the Training Division in the summer of 1967. Deceased August 11, 1998.

Henderson, Harvey. On WHD "thr[ough] most of the 1950s" (according to Coughlin) and was there until at least early 1962; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; nicknamed "The Birmingham Baron"; later, ASAIC of Birmingham, Alabama office; pictured on p. 70 of the AFAUSSS book (1991); pictured in Darwin Horn's book (in Burbank photo, arm out stretched toward the car). Deceased January 1994.

Hickey, George W., Jr. Garage; in Service from 1963 to 1971: Presidential and V.P. details; interviewed by HSCA (June 15, 1978); sued and lost over *Mortal Error*. Deceased.

Hill, Clinton J. Retired in July 1975 as Assistant Director at the age of 43; interviewed by Warren Commission (March 9, 1964), for Manchester, *The Death of a President* (November 18, 1964; May 20, 1965), and *60 Minutes* (December 7, 1975; November 1993); December 1963 newsreel regarding Treasury award (with C. Douglas Dillon as presenter); *Who Killed JFK: The Final Chapter?* (CBS, November 19, 1993); *The Secret Service* and *Inside the Secret Service* videos (1995); *Inside the U.S. Secret Service* documentary (2004); *Larry King Live* (March 22, 2006); pictured in AFAUSSS book (1991); pictured in Darwin Horn's book. Wife: Gwen Brown; two sons; brother-in-law: fellow former agent David B. Grant!

Holtzauer, John C. "Jack". Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; V.P. LBJ Detail 1961; part of the Counterfeit Division in 1969; p. 89 of Youngblood's book; p. 162 of Darwin Horn's book. Deceased October 19, 1998.

Hutch, Andrew M. Former member of White House Police; WHD, garage: November 18, 1963 onward (shift reports); Ford era: still WHD; p. 241 of Youngblood's book. Deceased 1991.

Jeffries, Jim. First Lady Detail; took part in Secret Service school number 8 in January 1956; WHD: Eisenhower; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; attended third annual AFAUSS conference in Alexandria, Virginia, September 27-28, 1974; pictured on pp. 62, 67, 70 of AFAUSSS book (1991).

Johns, Thomas Lemuel "Lem". Born December 11, 1925; 1978: Special Assistant to HEW Secretary Joseph Califano; retired from Secret Service in May 1975 after serving 21 years; also served two years with Alcohol & Tobacco Tax Unit; served first in the Birmingham, Alabama office; 1957–9: Chicago Office; 1959–60: WHD; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; 1960: transferred to Atlanta, Georgia office; 1960–3: called back to serve on the WHD in connection with protection matters at Middleburg, Virginia (Kennedy residence) and Hyannis Port, Massachusetts; 1962: V.P. LBJ Detail; ATSAIC; ASaic; Member of Inauguration Detail for LBJ, 1965; 1967: Assistant Director for Protective Forces; 1968: Head of Protective Force; 1969: transferred back to Birmingham, Alabama office as SAIC until retired in May 1975; his son served on the WHD late 1970s until date unknown; interviewed for Manchester, *The Death of a President* (November 19, 1964); interviewed by HSCA (August 8, 1978); 1999 comments to *Newsday*.

Johnsen, Richard E. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; Carter era: ASaic of Dignitary Protective Division; interviewed by HSCA (June 14, 1978); retired in 1979; short comment in *Mortal Error* (1992); pictured in David Lifton, *Best Evidence* (photo 42 B), and on p. 82 of the AFAUSSS book (1991).

Jones, John Paul. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; V.P. LBJ Detail 1961; first assignment was Eisenhower's grandkids; protected four presidents and drove Jackie Kennedy to the hospital for the birth of her son John Jr.; pp. 64–65 of Youngblood's book; spent 25 years with the Secret Service, working with presidents Eisenhower, Kennedy, Johnson and Nixon; also head of the Albuquerque Secret Service office twice before his retirement in 1979. Deceased March 2004.

Jones, Radford W. "Rad". WHD: November 12, 1963 onward (shift reports); retired in 1983 after 20 years of service; during his career, had been in charge of the Seattle, Washington and Alaska operations; served as a supervisor in a number of field offices and headquarters divisions; also assigned to Presidential, Vice Presidential, and foreign dignitary protective details; responsible for security coordination during the 1976 Presidential inauguration and three political conventions; teaches at the School of Criminology, MSU (graduate 1962); Manager of Security Department for Ford Motor Company and, like Burke and Blaine, a member of the Overseas Security Advisory Council (OSAC) for the U.S. Department of State; also a Security Administration instructor at MSU.

Jordan, Kent Dolson. First Lady Detail: temporary assignment from WFO from November 15, 1963 until at least November 23, 1963 (shift reports).

Keaner, Dale E. WHD: from November 23, 1963 until date unknown (November 1963 shift reports).

Keller, Brooks T. Nixon era: SAIC of St. Louis office; also had been assigned to the White House, Oklahoma City office, and the Paris office; became SAIC of Liaison with law enforcement agencies and the news media for the New York

office by the late 1970s; mentioned in McCarthy's book and Venker's book. Walt Coughlin wrote the author on February 29, 2004: "Now Brooks was a legend. When told to catch the next available transport back to the USA from Paris (for a discipline problem) he took the Queen Mary (8 days!). There are hundreds of stories about Brooks. He used to brag that he applied for a job as a life guard [at] Ocean City, M[arylan]d and the S[ecret] S[ervice] and he was turned down by Ocean City!!" Deceased.

Kellerman, Roy H. ASAIC; 1941 to December 1968; Kellerman was not White House Detail until 1942, and continued through 1951, and then returned to WHD in 1955; joined the Detroit office of the Service in December 1941; transferred February 9, 1942 to the Washington, D.C. field office after a 30-day assignment in the Cincinnati office; April 17, 1942: became member of White House Detail; February 7, 1951: transferred to Indianapolis office; February 1, 1955: went back to the White House Detail; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; on January 8, 1965 was made Deputy to Assistant Director of Protective Forces, replacing Boring; retired from the Service December 1968 as Assistant Administrator of the Service; interviewed by the FBI (November 22 and 27, 1963), the Warren Commission (March 9, 1964), Manchester's *The Death of a President* (November 17, 1964 and May 12, 1965), Walt Brown (1970), Newcomb and Adams (1970), CFTR radio (1976), and the HSCA (August 24–25, 1977; December 1, 1978); pictured in AFAUSSS book (1991); pictured in Darwin Horn's book. Wife: June; two daughters, ages 17 and 20 in 1964. Deceased March 22, 1984.

Kelley, Thomas J. Inspector; had been ASAIC of WFO in the 1950s; left the WFO during the summer of 1955 to become the SAIC of the Philadelphia office; took part in first formal Secret Service agent training held in Washington, D.C., October 19 – November 6, 1953 as an instructor; Instructor at Secret Service School, 1955; took part in the SAIC Administration School in 1955; ASAIC of WFO, mid-1950s; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; became Assistant Director of Investigations in 1965; 1968: Head of Protective Intelligence; Assistant Director: retired in February 1978, along with Peterson; attended AFAUSS conference in 1973; interviewed by the Warren Commission, Manchester's *The Death of a President* (October 9, 1964), Jim Bishop (?), May 19, 1970 letter to Harold Weisberg (*Post Mortem*, p. 274), and the HSCA (August 18, 1978; August 30, 1978: deposition; September 19, 1978: testimony); pictured on pp. 58, 63, 64, 83, 107 of the AFAUSS book (1991). Wife: Helen. Deceased.

Kinney, Samuel A. Garage; appointed to D.C. Metropolitan Police Department in 1950; assigned to Uniformed Division, White House Police Force in 1958; appointed to the Secret Service in 1960; retired in 1967; interviewed for Manchester's *The Death of a President* (February 19, 1965); interviewed by HSCA (February 26, 1978); short comments in *Mortal Error* (1992); *Today* show (November 22, 1993). Wife: Hazel. Deceased July 21, 1997.

Kivett, Jerry D. In Secret Service from September 8, 1961 to March 31, 1982; V.P. LBJ Detail; December 1963: assigned to Lady Bird's detail; Ford era: SAIC of Atlanta office; picture in Lady Bird Johnson's book, *White House Di-*

ary (Funk & Wagnall's Publishing Co., 1970); retired from Georgia Power Company on March 31, 2000.

Knetsch, Clarence. SAIC of LBJ Ranch; with LBJ back in 1961; came from the San Antonio field office; mentioned in Youngblood's book and LBJ Library Oral History. Deceased.

Knight, H. Stuart "Stu". SAIC of V.P. LBJ Detail; in Service from Truman to Reagan; took part in Secret Service school number 8 in January 1956; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961 (conducted protective survey jointly with WFO SAIC James M. Beary); became ASAIC of Los Angeles Field Office, 1966–9; Darwin Horn wrote the author on March 8, 2004: "He was never the SAIC but he could have been Acting SAIC from September 1969 to January 1970"; became Director in September 1973, replacing Rowley; replaced as Director in 1981 by John R. Simpson; mentioned frequently in Youngblood's book; contacted several times during HSCA era; also mentioned in McCarthy's, Venker's, and Horn's books on the Service; pictured in AFAUSSS book (1991).

Kollar, Robert L. 1978: ASAIC Ford Protective Detail; appointed to Secret Service July 23, 1962: Los Angeles office; December 2, 1962: assigned to V.P. LBJ Detail; 1963 – July 1969: WHD; July 27, 1969: went back to Los Angeles office; interviewed by HSCA (March 1, 1978); mentioned in Youngblood's, McCarthy's, and Horn's books on the Service. Wife: Eve.

Krill, Jackson N. OSS; took part in the SAIC Administration School in April 1956; Kansas City office of Secret Service regarding protection of the Trumans; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; Chief Inspector: debriefed agents after the assassination (including Robert Jamison—see his HSCA interview); Assistant Director of Inspections; aided in the re-organization of the Service after the Warren Commission made its recommendations; mentioned by Rowley during his Truman Library Oral History; pictured on p. 63 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Deceased January 20, 2000.

Landis, Paul E., Jr. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; First Lady Detail; up to LBJ era: in Service for five years; contacted by HSCA (February 17, 1979: outside contact report; see HSCA Report, p. 606); 1988: V.P. of Knutsen Machine Products in Cleveland, Ohio; *Columbus Dispatch* (November 20, 1988); interviewed for Edward Klein, *Just Jackie: Her Private Years* (Ballantine Books, 1999).

Lawrence, Elmer C. PRS; WFO, circa 1954–5; took part in Secret Service School number 4, January 10 – February 4, 1955; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; pictured on p. 64 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Deceased.

Lawson, Winston George. 1978: SAIC Liaison Division; joined Secret Service October 1959, entering the Syracuse, New York office; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; WHD: March 1961; interviewed by

Warren Commission (April 23, 1964) and HSCA (January 31, 1978; April 21, 1978); pictured on p. 101 of the AFAUSSS book (1991); short comments in *Mortal Error* (1992); *Inside the Secret Service* video (1995); Melanson, *The Secret Service* (2002). Wife: Barbara.

Lawton, Donald J. 1978: Intelligence Division; still in Secret Service as of November 22, 1997.

Lewis, J. Leroy. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; SAIC of Forgery Section; a charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969. Deceased.

Lilley, Robert E. From election night 1960 until October 1963; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; went to Boston office; 20-plus years in the Secret Service. Darwin Horn wrote the author on March 8, 2004: "Bob Lilley was the SAIC in St. Louis in about 1978."

Livingood, Wilson "Bill". Born October 1, 1936; MSU graduate, 1961; Dallas office: August 8, 1961 to November 1962; V.P. LBJ Detail November 1962 – November 1963; WHD November 1963 to 1977 (?); 1969: ATSAIC; 1974: ASAIC; 1978: became an Inspector; 1982: SAIC of Houston office; Deputy Assistant Director, Office of Training in 1986; subsequently served as Executive Assistant to the Director from 1989 until his retirement in January 1995; the last agent on active duty when President Kennedy was assassinated; personal highlight was advancing President Nixon's historic trip to China; CBS (1994, 1998–9); mentioned in Youngblood's book; Sergeant-at-Arms of the House of Representatives during Clinton and Bush years: appointed January 4, 1995; as Sergeant-at-Arms, oversaw all security issues related to the Speaker of the House, the Congressional Leadership, all Members of Congress, and physical security of the Capitol and House Office Buildings, also chief protocol officer of the House, and had the privilege of announcing the arrival of the President and other special guests for the State of the Union address; interviewed for Edward Klein, *Just Jackie: Her Private Years* (Ballantine Books, 1999).

Mastrovito, James M. In Secret Service 1959–79; 1960–2: WHD; Summer of 1962: went to Charleston, West Virginia office; Deputy, Intelligence Division for ten years before becoming the director a few years before he retired; in charge of the JFK assassination file at the Secret Service in the 1970s; April 1, 1997 ARRB interview.

Meredith, Lynn S. Kiddie detail; became the Assistant to the Director of Training (Howard Anderson) for the Training Division, in charge of administration, in the summer of 1967; in the Secret Service from 1951 to 1983; pictured in Gallagher's book; no relation to Lynn E. Meredith.

Metzinger, Richard "Dick". WHD: November 10, 1963 to November 23, 1963, returning to field office (shift reports). Former agent Walt Coughlin wrote the author on February 22, 2004: "Dick Metzinger worked a while w[ith] us on

the V.P. Detail. I recall he was a temp (maybe permanent) from Baltimore F.O. and resigned early in his career.”

McCann, Gerard B. “Jerry”. ASAIC during Truman and Eisenhower years; went to Cincinnati office afterwards; worked 33 years for the Secret Service, beginning in 1936 as a clerk in his native Scranton, Pennsylvania; later became a special agent and served on the White House detail during the Roosevelt, Truman and Eisenhower administrations; took part in the SAIC Administration School in April 1956; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; Inspector; later, Deputy Assistant to the Director (around 1967); attended third annual AFAUSS conference in Alexandria, Virginia, September 27–28, 1974; interviewed for *Truman* (1992); mentioned on p. 18 of Youngblood’s book; pictured on p. 63 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 27, 2004: “Gerry McCann was my shift leader for about one year then he was transferred to Cincinnati as the SAIC and Floyd Boring took over his shift.” Deceased.

McCarthy, John J. WHD: November 10, 1963 to November 23, 1963, returning to field office, most likely Washington (shift reports).

McIntyre, William “Tim”. Born May 13, 1935; married with four children; arrived at the WHD in the Fall of 1963 from a two-man office in Spokane, Washington; 1978: Inspector; interviewed by HSCA (January 31, 1978), *The Dark Side of Camelot*, ABC (December 4, 1997; January 28, 1998).

Miller, Chester J. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961, for PRS; ASAIC of PRS; SAIC San Diego, California office, 1970s.

Morey, Edward. WHD: at least November 1, 1963 through November 23, 1963 (shift reports).

Newman, Larry. Joined the Service in 1960; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; assigned to the WHD in October 1961; left the WHD in October 1963, not long before the assassination—went to the San Francisco, California office (and, allegedly, the WFO); worked in Secret Service field offices on the West Coast for the next twenty years; became chief of security for Western Union after retiring; also worked for the IRS and DEA; *The Dark Side of Camelot*, ABC (December 4, 1997 and January 28, 1998); interviewed for Edward Klein, *Just Jackie: Her Private Years* (Ballantine Books, 1999). No relation to JFK friend with same name.

Noonan, Joseph E., Jr. Born September 11, 1930; came to Chicago office on November 2, 1959; remained there until February 1961: transferred to WHD; June 1962: transferred back to Chicago; as of April 1978, in charge of intelligence operations for the Chicago office; June 1978: transferred to Los Angeles, California office; interviewed by HSCA (April 13, 1978; July 14, 1978: deposition).

Norton, Howard K. PRS photographer; in Austin November 22, 1963, plus photographed limousine November 23, 1963. According to Dale Wunderlich:

"[Norton was] the first 'Security Technician' that was hired by the USSS. He was retired from the Air Force where I believe that he was a Sergeant Major in OSI. He was never a Special Agent, but was extremely knowledgeable in the field of electronics and electronic countermeasures. In fact, I was told by a friend of his that he was one of the technicians that discovered the resonance cavity that the Russians planted in the U.S. seal that was given to the U. S. Ambassador to Moscow, Russia."

Nunn, Roy (Gene). WHD: November 11, 1963 up to at least November 23, 1963 (shift reports); had been on JFK's Nashville trip, May 18, 1963; retired around 1975; went to work for FEMA.

O'Leary, John J. "Muggsy". Driver, luggage; from JFK's Senate days; interviewed for Manchester's *The Death of a President* (November 10, 1964); picture in Gallagher's book. Deceased.

Olsson, Ernest E., Jr. Carter era: Inspection Division headquarters; interviewed by HSCA (June 12, 1978).

O'Rourke, Gerald W. WHD: November 11, 1963 onward (shift reports).

Paoella, Joseph. In Secret Service from Eisenhower to LBJ; allegedly first agent of Italian descent to be assigned to WHD; WHD and Chicago office; left agency in 1964 due to dislike of LBJ; *The Dark Side of Camelot*, ABC (December 4, 1997); now a private detective and polygraph examiner.

Parker, Jack. 1961 (see 3 HSCA 400); Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961, as a member of the WFO. Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 22, 2004: "Jack Parker who was one notch ahead of me on the Detail. He worked for Gerry McCann and Floyd Boring when McCann left for Cincinnati. Jack ultimately went into PRS and was there during 1968. That was a difficult assignment. He is now deceased, having expired early in life. He smoked like a chimney." Deceased.

Paterni, Paul J. OSS; joined the Secret Service in 1933; Truman to Eisenhower: SAIC of San Francisco office, then went to Chicago in approximately 1957 as SAIC, replacing Anheier; Deputy Chief as of January 31, 1961, replacing Daniels; into LBJ era (see also 5 H 67; 7 H 354, 403; 13 H 65); a charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969; Anthony Summers, *The Arrogance of Power*, p. 560. Deceased 1984.

Payne, William B. "Bill". LBJ era: was advance man for May 1964 Atlanta trip (Youngblood's book, pp. 160, 162); mentioned on the Air Force One tapes (November 22, 1963) with Burke; pictured on p. 117, to the right of Lawson, in Lois Anderson, *John F. Kennedy*; mentioned by Bill Moyers on A&E (1992). Deceased.

Peterson, Burrill A. Inspector; 1968: made head of Investigations; joined the agency in 1941; WHD: FDR era; 1945: joined Army and served in the War Crimes Trial; returned to the Secret Service in 1946; took part in third Se-

cret Service school held in November and December of 1954; took part in the SAIC Administration School in 1955; took part in the SAIC Administration School in April 1956; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; retired in February 1978 as an Assistant Director (held this position since at least 1971), along with Kelley; interviewed for Manchester's *The Death of a President* (October 9, 1964; November 17, 1964; November 18, 1964; February 5, 1965); p. 12 of *Secret Service Chief*; p. 176 of *Special Agent*; pp. 259–260 of *Johnny, We Hardly Knew Ye*; pictured on pp. 62, 63, 103, 133 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 28, 2004: "Mr. Peterson was responsible for me going to Paris. I had been in L.A. for almost 20 years and they wanted me to leave. Go some other place and I didn't want to leave. Working with Bob Powis was as good as it got ... but later I was delighted that Mr. Peterson asked me to go. He groomed quite a few people who later became the Director or Deputy Director. A nice person." Wife: Virginia. Deceased November 6, 1995.

Phillips, Max D. PRS; had been on Eisenhower's "grandkiddie" detail along with Bert de Freese (*Secret Service Chief*, p. 140); Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; in Service up to Carter era (see also 23 H 418); HSCA era: Sacramento, California office.

Pine, Walter. PRS; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; attended third annual AFAUSS conference in Alexandria, Virginia, September 27–28, 1974. Former agent Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 25, 2004: "Walter Pine was the brother-in-law to Chief Baughman and I believe he worked the WFO and PRS." Deceased.

Pontius, Ronald M. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; Member of Inauguration Detail for LBJ, 1965; WHD: up to and including Ford era; involved in Sarah Jane Moore investigation in 1975; mentioned in Melanson's book, p. 64, Youngblood's book, p. 195 (regarding Australia trip), and *The Flying White House*, p. 94; pictured on pp. 85, 87, 95, 96 of AFAUSSS book (1991); 20-plus years in the Secret Service. Walt Coughlin wrote the author on April 26, 2005: "Pontius a great guy. Still lives in San Clemente." For his part, Dar Horn wrote the author on May 3, 2005: "Ron lives out here in San Clemente, I believe. I speak to him via telephone on occasion."

Ready, John David "Jack". Born August 12, 1927; assigned to Secret Service Spring 1961: assigned to WHD, with temporary assignments at Hyannis Port and Palm Beach; WHD: 1961–8; 1968–78: San Diego office, V.P. Agnew Detail, Dr. Kissinger Detail, Watergate and White House tapes; 1978: ASAIC, Nixon Protective Division; interviewed by HSCA (March 1, 1978); contacted by author of *Mortal Error* (1992); refused to discuss matter; p. 226 of Darwin Horn's book.

Roberts, Emory P. ATSAIC; served on the WHD during the Truman era; on V.P. Nixon's trip to Caracas, Venezuela, May 13, 1958; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; interviewed for Manchester's *The Death of*

a President (December 4, 1964; April 26, 1965). Wife: Betty; two sons: Douglas and Steven. Deceased October 8, 1973.

Rodham, Wade J. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; SAIC of Kennedy Residence in Atoka–Middleburg, Virginia; up to at least LBJ era; mentioned in Dorman's book and Youngblood's book regarding V.P. Nixon, Caracas, May 13, 1958; pictured on p. 64 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Deceased 1983.

Rowley, Chief James Joseph "Jim". FBI 1937–8; joined the Secret Service September 12, 1938; became a member of the WHD 1939; SAIC 1946 – September 1961; Chief/Director (title changed in 1965): September 1, 1961 – September 1973; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; interviewed by the Warren Commission; interviewed for Manchester's *The Death of a President* (May 1, 1964); Jim Bishop; LBJ Library (January 22, 1969); Truman Library (September 20, 1988); interviewed by the HSCA (August 18, 1978: deposition; August 24, 1978: deposition; September 19, 1978: testimony); *Truman* (1992); short comments in *Mortal Error* (1992); attended third annual AFAUSS conference in Alexandria, Virginia, September 27–28, 1974. Secret Service training facility in Beltsville, Maryland named after Rowley. Wife of 52 years: the former Mabel Rita Cluen of Leisure World; three daughters: Claudia Dailey of Columbia, Linda Graham of Chevy Chase, Maryland, and Donna Ryan of Alexandria, Virginia; brother: Rev. Francis P. Rowley, S.J., of Blauvelt, New York; sister: Marge Borise of Greenwich, Connecticut; eight grandchildren. Deceased November 1, 1992.

Rundle, Paul S. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; AT-SAIC of V.P. LBJ Detail (see also 16 H 950–1; 18 H 814; p. 93 of Youngblood's book); Paris Office, approximately 1965; became Assistant Director of special agent training at the Training Division in the summer of 1967; SAIC of Protective Forces (May 1974); pictured in Darwin Horn's book. Darwin Horn wrote the author on March 1, 2004: "Rundle was never the SAIC of the WHD. He did become DAD [Deputy Assistant Director] of Protection which kind of stepped over the SAIC of the WHD."

Rybka, Henry J. "Hank". Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961, as a Special Officer (SO): drove one of the two follow-up cars; garage; pictured on p. 85 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Deceased December 25, 1975 (according to Lawson).

Shannon, Michael J. V.P. LBJ Detail.

Sherman, Anthony, Jr. In Secret Service 1958–80; on WHD September 1961 – October 1963; transferred to Spokane, Washington office shortly before JFK's assassination; retired as SAIC of the San Francisco Field Office; *The Dark Side of Camelot*, ABC (December 4, 1997); *Dateline* (March 1998).

Shipman, Thomas B. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; driver; see *A Million Miles of Presidents*, p. 211; pictured on p. 69 of the AFAUSSS book (1991). Deceased October 14, 1963.

Snow, Robert R. "Bob". Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961 (December 10, 2004 email from Snow to author: "... what the official report doesn't show was that I was *damn* cold while standing post between 14th and 15th"); retired in 1992 after 33 years in the service; P.R., Headquarters; consultant to *In the Line of Fire* movie, as well as *The American President*, *Absolute Power*, *Contact*, *Air Force One*, and *Dick*. Snow wrote the author on March 9, 2004: "During the Kennedy and Johnson years I was working in the Secret Service office in Buffalo, N[ew] Y[ork]. Counterfeiting and forgeries of Government obligations was my major concern at the time ... I went to Washington in 1966 but continued in the criminal areas of Secret Service responsibility. I was assigned to the White House during the Ford and Carter years and then went to Headquarters."

Stoner, Frank G. Went to American University; in the Secret Service from December 1945 until June 1969 (Truman to Nixon); PRS Liaison Officer (see also 5 H 581); took part in Secret Service School number 4, January 10 – February 4, 1955; Member of Inauguration Detail for Eisenhower, 1957; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; Member of Inauguration Detail for LBJ, 1965; 1962: WFO (see 3 HSCA 435); LBJ era: author of report regarding Antonio Andres Rodriquez Y Eschazabal (December 15, 1964 Memorandum from Stoner to Elliot Thacker); Information and Liaison (June 23, 1966 Uteg Report; October 12, 1966 Memorandum from Stoner to Ronald Towns); a charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969; attended third annual AFAUSS conference in Alexandria, Virginia, September 27–28, 1974. Former agent Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 27, 2004: "I believe that he worked the St. Louis office for a long time and that he was transferred to Washington to work with Harold Polenz in the Travel Voucher Section. Frank must be in his late 80s by now. He must have joined Polenz somewhere about 1955 or '56." Wife: Elaine Davenport.

Stout, Stewart G. "Stu", Jr. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; ATSAIC; a charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969; pictured in AFAUSSS book (1991); picture appears in Mark North's *Act of Treason*; pictured on the cover of Darwin Horn's book. Taylor, Charles E., Jr. V.P. LBJ Detail, 1961; member of WFO, 1950s; on V.P. Nixon's trip to Caracas, Venezuela, May 13, 1958; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; involved in limo inspection on November 22, 1963 (as part of the WFO: CD 80; see also 3 HSCA 401); March 1976 Affidavit to Church Committee; pictured on p. 64 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Darwin Horn wrote the author on March 1, 2004: "I worked with him in WFO. We were good friends."

Taylor, Robert H. "Bob". Served on the WHD during Truman era; took part in Secret Service School number 4, January 10 – February 4, 1955; V.P. Nixon's detail, including Caracas, Venezuela; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; SAIC of WHD during part of LBJ time and most of Nixon's presidency—let go by Haldeman in 1972 (along with Duncan) and moved to the Foreign Dignitaries Protection Detail of which he became the SAIC in 1977 (in between, became chief of security for Nelson Rockefeller); mentioned in McNally's book, p. 120, and Youngblood' book; see also *The Flying White House*, pp. 260–1; Venker, pp. 56–58, 149; McCarthy, pp. 201–2; Melanson, pp. 67, 157; pictured on pp. 67, 102 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Deceased early 1980s.

Taylor, Warren "Woody". Assigned to Lady Bird Johnson: still in that position as of August 3, 1967; Ford era: ASAIC of WHD; pictured in Lady Bird Johnson's book, *White House Diary*, with Kivett; interviewed by HSCA (June 14, 1978): by then, in Dignitary Protective Division.

Thacker, Elliot C. Head Inspector of PRS (see also 5 H 581); had been the SAIC of Richmond previously; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961, as a member of the WFO (ASAIC). Deceased.

Thompson, Ken. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; member of Los Angeles Field office, approximately 1961–2; WHD: November 23, 1963 onward (shift reports). Darwin Horn wrote the author on March 1, 2004: "He was the best young agent that we ever had in Los Angeles. Fun to work with."

Torina, Michael W. Chief Inspector; became an agent during the FDR era; served on the WHD during the Truman era; took part in first formal Secret Service agent training held in Washington, D.C., October 19 – November 6, 1953 as an instructor; took part in Secret Service School number 4, January 10 – February 4, 1955 as an instructor; took part in the SAIC Administration School in April 1956; SAIC of Chicago office, 1964; spent 30 years in the Secret Service; Manchester, p. 32: 1961 interview; a charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969; attended AFAUSS conference in 1973; pictured on pp. 58, 63 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 28, 2004: "I did not interact with Mike Torina. I think that he was more of an administrative agent rather than a street agent."

Tucker, Edward Z. "Kiddie Detail" in 1961; later, Chicago office; in Service up to Nixon era; interviewed by HSCA (January 19, 1978; July 18, 1978: deposition; August 22, 1978).

Walsh, John F. "Jack". V.P. LBJ Detail 1961; "Kiddie Detail" 1961; became SAIC of this detail April 1968; *Star* (June 28, 1994).

Warner, John W., Jr. (III) "Jack". Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; Inspector; Public Affairs Office; at least up to Reagan era; interviewed for Manchester's *The Death of a President* (June 2, 1964; November 18, 1964; February 5, 1965; May 12, 1965); see p. 555 of *Post Mortem*; CFTR radio (1976); consultant on *In the Line of Fire* movie.

Weaver, Glenn. WHD: Eisenhower era; had been a member of the Los Angeles field office from at least 1960–3; WHD: November 23, 1963 start as per shift report; became SAIC of V.P. Elect Detail during 1964 campaign; SAIC of V.P. Detail; Nixon era: guarded former V.P. Humphrey in 1969; Carter era: SAIC of an office; see also pp. 93, 200 of Youngblood's book; pictured on pp. 85, 91 of the AFAUSSS book (1991); pictured in Darwin Horn's book. Darwin Horn wrote the author on March 8, 2004: "Glenn Weaver worked on [Eisenhower] Detail and then came to L[os] A[ngeles]. I think that he started in Detroit and then went to [Washington D.C.]. After the WHD he came to L[os] A[ngeles] and then was assigned to the LBJ Detail when he was VP. He was in Charge of HHH [Humphrey] Detail in 1968. He ended up as SAIC in Denver. We lived close together and worked a lot together. An excellent agent." For his part, Walt Coughlin wrote the author on April 28, 2005: "Glenn & Warner [Brown] are 2 of my best five friends. Email them often and talk to them (phone) monthly."

Wells, Thomas Howard. "Kiddie Detail"; interviewed for Manchester's *The Death of a President* (December 18, 1964); pictured in Gallagher's book; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; Jacksonville native—now works in Tallahassee as chief of inspections for the Florida Highway Patrol; with wife Shirley recently built a house in Ponte Vedra Beach; guarded the Kennedy children from November 1962 until August 1964; spent 22 years in the Secret Service; joined the Secret Service in 1959 after graduating from Florida State University; assignments included the White House, the Vice President's Office, field work and coordinating security for funerals for Presidents Truman and Johnson, and as an inspector in the director's office; retired in 1981 to go into private industry; over next few years served as director of public safety for Alabama (1987–91), traveled the country as a criminal justice consultant, and was deputy comptroller for Florida; *20/20* (July 1999) (with two other agents); Jacksonville, Florida *Times-Union* (August 2, 1999).

vember 6, 1953 as an instructor; instructor for Secret Service School number 4, January 10 –February 4, 1955; Denver office, 1930s; a charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969; pictured on pp. 59, 69 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Deceased.

Winslow, Carroll A. Secretary.

Wunderlich, A. Dale. PRS; pictured in Darwin Horn's book; now part of an acclaimed security firm with Bill Duncan. Former agent Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 22, 2004: "Dale Wunderlich was on the LAPD and we recruited him. I did his background. He was a very knowledgeable young agent and left us after several years in D.C. and Denver. Still a good friend." Horn later wrote the author on February 28, 2004: "Wunderlich was one of my guys. I did his background. A very smart, intelligent good police officer. I didn't know that he and [Bill] Duncan were affiliated in that business. Dale travels much of the time."

Yeager, John Frank. 1957 graduate of Centre College; interviewed for Edward Klein, *Just Jackie: Her Private Years* (Ballantine Books, 1999).

Young, Walter H. PRS: head of files section; in 1965 was made Assistant Director for Protective Intelligence (see also 5 H 581). Deceased 1996.

Youngblood, Rufus Wayne. ASAIC of V.P. LBJ Detail; joined the Secret Service in March 1951; started in the Atlanta, Georgia office; transferred to the WFO in August 1952; joined the WHD in February 1953 and stayed until the end of 1957; went back to the Atlanta office from 1958–60; at the end of 1960 came to Washington on a temporary assignment including as a member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; rejoined WHD March 1961; a few weeks later, became part of the V.P. LBJ Detail that at that time was part of the WFO; became one of the ASAICs of the WHD after the assassination; Member of Inauguration Detail for LBJ, 1965; went on to become the SAIC, then, in November 1965, the Assistant Director of Protective Forces; December 1967: Deputy Director until retired by Haldeman in 1971; December 1963 newsreel regarding Treasury award; see Venker, p. 45; interviewed by the Warren Commission (March 9, 1964); interviewed for Manchester's *The Death of a President* (November 17, 1964); LBJ Library December 17, 1968; his own book *20 Years in the Secret Service* (Darwin Horn wrote the author on March 1, 2004: "I read the book that Rufus wrote. He was a very good friend of mine. Horn wrote the author on February 22, 2004: "Lilburn (Pat) Boggs was one of the best agents of all time. We worked Los Angeles together as young agents and then made the Detail together. He for the second time ... me for the first. He became the ASAIC in Los Angeles in 1960 to 1966 and then took over Chicago for the 1968 Convention. Some fun." Deceased October 16, 1994.

Burke, James T. Member of WHD during Truman era; took part in Secret Service school number 8 in January 1956; took part in the SAIC Administration School in April 1956; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; Acting SAIC in early 1963 before transferring to Detroit, Michigan as SAIC; Inspector, LBJ era; Ford era: was Assistant Director of Protective Intelligence involved with investigations of Ford assassination attempts and handling JFK assassination information inquiries (October 28, 1975 Memorandum from SAIC Jordan to Assistant Director Burke—Protective Intelligence); still Assistant Director in 1978, HSCA–Carter era; pictured on pp. 62, 63 of AFAUSSS book (1991).

Cooney, Mary. Clerical aide. Deceased.

Cross, Conrad C. African–American; interviewed by HSCA (April 14, 1978).

Griffiths, James S. Born August 17, 1934; 1978: SAIC, Special Investigations; started in agency August 1961 in Chicago office; interviewed by HSCA (February 1, 1978). After the war, he was an investigator with the U.S. Postal Service in New York. Mr. Motto joined the Secret Service in 1949 and over the years worked in field offices in St. Louis, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Springfield and Washington, D.C. He retired in 1970 as the assistant to the special agent in charge of the Chicago field office. Mr. Motto and his late brother Carmine, also a Secret Service agent, were renowned for their undercover work, colleagues and family members said. ‘Both my dad and my uncle were very, very low-key people,’ said Mr. Motto’s niece, Irene Kaufman. ‘I think that’s what helped them both be very successful undercover agents.’ During his Secret Service career, Mr. Motto solved several counterfeiting cases, and he had numerous adventures guarding presidents, recalled his longtime neighbor, Terry Mejdrech. Mr. Motto used to tell the story about how he once had to tackle President Harry Truman when there was some gunfire outside of where Truman was staying and Mr. Motto thought the president was too near the window, Mejdrech said. In the excitement, Mr. Motto yelled and actually swore at Truman, she said. ‘The next day, he thought he was going to be fired for sure,’ Mejdrech said. ‘But Truman thanked him profusely.’ After his career with the Secret Service, Mr. Motto

held several state and local police jobs and worked as a private investigator, retiring fully only about five years ago." Deceased March 19, 2002.

Cantrell, William A. "Bill". Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; attended third annual AFAUSS conference in Alexandria, Virginia, September 27-28, 1974.

Carnes, Cedrick. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; St. Louis Office.

Carrell, John. Took part in security of Kennedy family right after RFK assassination.

Cussick. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; clerk.

Decima, Earl E. Member of Transportation Section, LBJ era.

DeProspero, Robert. A 1959 graduate of WVU, he is a member of the School of Physical Education Hall of Fame and WVU Academy of Distinguished Alumni; assigned to protect Presidents Eisenhower, Johnson, Ford, Carter and Reagan; served 1965–86; was SAIC of Reagan Detail after Parr, approximately late 1981 to early 1985; became the Chief Executive Officer of O’Gara Protective Services Inc. of Chantilly, Virginia; pictured in the AFAUSSS book (1991). Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 22, 2004: “I recall Bob deProspero and believe that he was on the follow up car during Dallas [???].” Walt Coughlin wrote the author on February 24, 2004: “Believe he came in[to] S[ecret] S[ervice] in 1965. Never worked for or with him. Good professional reputation.” Daughter: Robin L. DeProspero, chief of the Personnel Security Branch, Special Investigations and Security Division.

Endicott, Mike. Joined the Service and was still in the Service during the Nixon era; during the Carter era was SAIC of ex-President Nixon's White House Detail in New York.

Nixon's trip to Caracas, Venezuela, May 13, 1958; member of the Eisenhower children's detail with Richard McCully and Bill Barton; JFK era?; charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969; pictured on pp. 53, 66 of the AFAUSSS book (1991); pictured in Darwin Horn's book, Carmel, California, with Eisenhower, right front of car. Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 26, 2004: "Dale died of diabetes many years ago. He was a WW II Navy pilot."

Grube, Robert F. Protected V.P. Nixon during 1960 campaign; joined the Secret Service in 1938 as a clerk; took part in first formal Secret Service agent training held in Washington, D.C., October 19 – November 6, 1953; took part in third Secret Service school held in November and December of 1954 as an instructor; took part in Secret Service School number 4, January 10 – February 4, 1955 as an instructor; took part in the SAIC Administration school in April 1956; pictured on pp. 60, 62, 63, 71 of the AFAUSSS book (1991); son of Alfred F. Heyn, Robert "Bob". Member of Los Angeles Field Office for at least 1963–4; WHD: LBJ era; p. 230 of Youngblood's book; in 1968, member of Sacramento Office.

Johnson, Jimmy. 1956 graduate of Centre College.

Knierim. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961.

Lanier, Glenard. Chief of WHP 1967 to early Nixon era; pictured in AFAUSSS book (1991).

Lardner, John J. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961.

Lau, Arnold. Became the Assistant Director of Training, advanced special training, for the Training Division in the summer of 1967; later became the Director of Training; pictured on pp. 97, 103 of AFAUSSS book (1991).

Magaw, John W. WHD: Ford–Bush Sr.; entered Secret Service in 1967; started in Columbus, Ohio office; former Ohio State Trooper; SAIC under Bush Sr.; Director under Bush and Clinton; became ATF Director after Waco (federal service extended until December 31, 1998).

Mampel, Robert A. “Bob”. MSU graduate; took part in Secret Service School number 4, January 10 – February 4, 1955; WHD: Eisenhower; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; pictured on p. 66 of AFAUSSS book (1991).

Marass, Charles J. WHD approximately 1955–8; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; in the Secret Service from April 4, 1955 to December 31, 1979; pictured on pp. 67, 70 of AFAUSSS book from 1991; pictured in Darwin Horn’s book.

McCarthy, Dennis V. N. LBJ–Reagan; wrote book, *Protecting the President* in 1985. Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 24, 2004: “Throughout the years Dennis McCarthy and I have worked together. I believe that he was primarily an Intelligence Division agent.” Horn later wrote (March 1, 2004): “Read McCarthy’s [book] but some parts embarrassed me. Some young people would read that book and think that agents are doing nothing but hunting girls in all parts of the world. Not true. Dennis did not do us very well by writing in such a manner. When I started writing my book I made a resolution that it would not be like his.” Walt Coughlin wrote the author on March 1, 2004: “I agree w[ith] Snow. [Bob Snow is on record (*Washington Post*, 1993) as saying the book is ‘an embarrassment’.] McCarthy could never (nor did he) carry his weight.” Deceased.

Motto, Carmine J. Took part in the SAIC Administration School in April 1956; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; pictured on pp. 63, 72, 75 of AFAUSSS book (1991); author of the 1999 book *In Crime's Way: A Generation of Secret Service Adventures*. Deceased March 3, 2002.

Mullady, B. J. Took part in Secret Service School number 4, January 10 – February 4, 1955; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961.

Nagel, Fred. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; later, a member of the Los Angeles Field Office; mentioned in Darwin Horn's book.

Neal, Harry Edward. Took part in first formal Secret Service agent training held in Washington, D.C., October 19 – November 6, 1953 as an instructor; Instructor for Secret Service School number 4, January 10 – February 4, 1955; took part in the SAIC Administration School in 1955; took part in the SAIC Administration School in April 1956; a charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969; attended third annual AFAUSS conference in Alexandria, Virginia, September 27–28, 1974; author of three books on the Secret Service; pictured on pp. 58, 63, 69 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Deceased 1993.

Newbrand, Robert "Bob". Took part in Secret Service school number 8 in January 1956; Guarded Chief Justice Warren with Elmer Moore: see p. 170 of Youngblood's book; pictured on p. 62 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 22, 2004: "[Jack Parker] smoked like a chimney as did Bob Newbrand who also died early. We were all on the same shift as was Stu Knight." Deceased.

O'Driscoll, Daniel J. Member of WFO in 1954; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; took part in third Secret Service school held in November and December 1954; pictured on p. 62 of AFAUSSS book (1991).

O'Malley, Andrew P. "Drew". Member of WHD: Truman era; took part in first formal Secret Service agent training held in Washington, D.C., October 19 – November 6, 1953; on V.P. Nixon's trip to Caracas, Venezuela, May 13, 1958; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961 (listed as SAIC); attended third annual AFAUSS conference in Alexandria, Virginia, September 27–28, 1974; pictured on pp. 61, 64 of the AFAUSSS book (1991).

Quinn, Richard. Took part in Secret Service school number 8 in January 1956; pictured on p. 62 of the AFAUSSS book (1991); JFK era?

Ray, David. 1959 graduate of Centre College; retired in 1996 after 31 years in the service.

Schley, John E. On V.P. Nixon's trip to Caracas, Venezuela, May 13, 1958; JFK era?

Schoel, Earl. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; SAIC of Denver office; Darwin Horn wrote the author on March 3, 2004: "We worked with him when Ike went to Denver during the summers. One great SAIC and person."

Sherwood, John T. "Jack". Member of WHD: Truman era; SAIC of V.P. Nixon Detail; took part in the SAIC Administration School in April 1956; President Nixon era: became the Special Assistant for the Secret Service to the Director, Office of Law Enforcement, Treasury Department; a charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969; pictured on pp. 63, 68, 71 of AFAUSSS book (1991). Deceased August 15, 1998.

Slade, Will. Member of Transportation Section, LBJ era.

Spencer, Leon. Photographer, Visual Intelligence Branch, LBJ era.

Spicer, Vernon. WHD: FDR-Truman era; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; SAIC of Charlotte, North Carolina office; charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969; pictured on pp. 37, 53 of the AFAUSSS book (1991).

Stringfield. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961.

Sweazey, Mac. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961.

Taylor, John. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; took part in Secret Service school number 8 in January 1956; pictured on p. 62 of the AFAUSSS book (1991).

Taylor, Norman. Member of Indianapolis Office at least up to 1970.

Towns, Ronald C. In Secret Service from at least Eisenhower to Carter; LBJ era: SAIC, Intelligence Division. Darwin Horn wrote the author on February 28, 2004: "I knew Ron as we were on the WHD at the same time."

Tucker, Kevin M. Guarded Jackie and the kids in the late '60s.

Usher, Paul T. WHD 1952: Truman; Youngblood's supervisor on his first temporary assignment; Eisenhower era: Acting SAIC of the Charleston, West Virginia office until approximately 1957, and became SAIC of the Pittsburgh office; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961 (SAIC);

charter member of the AFAUSSS in 1969; pictured on p. 93 of the AFAUSSS book (1991).

Vance, Chuck. Continued through Nixon era; Carter era: left the Service in late 1970s; married Susan Ford (now divorced); President of Vance International.

Wagner. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961.

Walsh, Edward P. *The Washington Post* (May 15, 1998); Walsh protected LBJ and Nixon.

Weed, Bob. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961.

Weinstein, Myron I. "Mike". Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; mentioned in *Chicago Independent* (November 1975) as having come from Minneapolis to help with the investigation of the Chicago plot in November 1963; during Ford era: Assistant Director (Inspection); Carter era: Assistant Director (Inspection), then moved to Assistant Director (Protective Intelligence), until promoted to Deputy Director upon the retirement of Boggs; Reagan era: Deputy Director.

Whipp. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; PRS (SE).

White, Tom. Took part in Secret Service school number 8 held in January 1956; Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961; PRS?; pictured on p. 62 of AFAUSSS book (1991).

Wilson. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961.

Wood, Frank B. Member of Inauguration Detail for JFK, January 20, 1961 (SAIC); took part in the SAIC Administration School held in April 1956; pictured on p. 63 of the AFAUSSS book (1991).

Woodham.

Wooge, Thomas K. Member of WFO and WHD during the Eisenhower era; pictured on pp. 64, 67, 70 of the AFAUSSS book (1991). Darwin Horn wrote the author on March 2, 2004: "Wooge passed away in Buffalo from a heart attack. He had been a basketball player in college ... was with us on the WHD ... we never knew he had a heart problem. He was a young man when it happened." Deceased October 17, 1968: died of a heart attack while protecting a Presidential candidate in Rochester, New York.

Zarvos, Nick. Assigned to presidential candidate George Wallace in 1968, as well as in 1972; shot during assassination attempt on Wallace in 1972.

Summary

There are 444 persons listed above. The HSCA stated:

In November 1963, there were 552 employees of the Secret Service—313 agents and 131 clerks from 66 field offices; 30 employees in the office of the Chief; 36 members of the WHD; 6 special agent-drivers; 8 special agents assigned to the Kennedy family; 5 special officers assigned to the Kennedy home in Hyannis Port, MA.

This is a total of 529. However, if you add the Chief and the Deputy Chiefs (assuming they are not a part of the “30 employees for the office of the Chief”), PRS agents, as well as the Inspectors, the total may come close to 552.

There were 70 special agents and 8 clerks—14% of agency resources—assigned to protect the President and the Vice President or to the PRS. According to the HSCA, 28 special agents were on the Texas trip (HSCA Report, p. 228; 3 HSCA 322). This number is in error. However, 28 agents *did* accompany JFK to Fort Worth (18 H 670). Perhaps this is the origin of this error.
